RTP included in clinical program at the Griffith Edwards Centre (GEC) Addictions Unit Day Program

RTP Speaker's Group – Senior Peer Mentors Bernie and Robert actively participate in the clinical program at the GEC by facilitating a weekly support group in which former patients share their experiences recovering from addiction, allowing patients to learn ways of coping from each other.

Bernard St-L was a member of the first cohort of peer mentors in 2016. Since then he has helped train 36 peer mentors. Bernard volunteers with the Speakers' Group because he knows how much the participants appreciate hearing and learning from people who were once where they are now.

Robert B. is a Senior Peer Mentor who has helped with training new mentors, as well as being a part of the RTP Management Committee. His interest in the Speakers' Group stems from his participation in speaker/discussion meetings he attends at secular AA meetings where everyone has a voice.

Hi, I'm Jillian, I'm very new to the RTP having just finished my Peer Mentor training with the 6th cohort. I had trouble finding a community where I could not only be open about my mental health struggles with social anxiety and BPD, but where my

experiences could bring support and a positive impact to others... until I was told about the RTP. In starting to mentor I've been able to acknowledge my own recovery and the positive changes in my life, I have to in order to support another person trying to do the same. It's hard to explain how difficult that is, and yet so important.
